## Worksheet 3: Reformulating hypotheses into research questions

We can define a hypothesis as an assumption / prediction about the future answer to a previously formulated research question. Below are some examples of research hypotheses. Try to assign one research question to each hypothesis.

<b>Hypothesis</b> : Students entering the labor market have an insufficient level of social and personal competences.
Research question:
Hypothesis: Multilevel governance in the European Union does not work when the pace of integration slows down and crises appear.
Research question:
<b>Hypothesis</b> : Women who have experienced sexual assault in the past have greater confidence in the police.
Research question:
<b>Hypothesis</b> : There is a relationship between the family type and the level of aggression as children from dysfunctional families show a higher level of aggression.

<b>Hypothesis</b> : Employees' identification with the mission and vision of the organization fosters a sense of job satisfaction.

<b>Hypothesis</b> : The longer the service, the more often employees of the "Computers and Telephones" enterprise complain about the feeling of professional burnout.
